



RideMyRoute[®] is a service developed by the SocialCar research consortium. It offers an app and API that allows you to connect public mobility data with private mobility, most prominently carpooling.

WHY?

Passengers will love it, and planners cannot ignore it. We claim that with #RideMy-Route, passengers know more than planners, and this changes the logic of transport policy making. We performed a number of macro-simulations and tests with real-life users, and can prove what we claim with modelling and empirical data. #RideMyRoute will grow in popularity as it benefits citizens, alleviates accessibility inequalities without burdening public budgets and protects the environment.


